## 9 Simple Camping Rules

Primitive camping is provided free of charge in designated areas on the club grounds for Reckoning on the Rock participants. Please remember you're still surrounded by other people. And all those people are looking to enjoy their shoot time also. To ensure other campers enjoy their experience as much as you, it's important to follow these simple rules and courtesies.

- 1. Clean your site:** Don't leave a dirty site for the wadies and match officials to clean up. Remember the motto: take out what you bring in.
- 2. Put your fire out:** Because you can endanger those around you, this is one of the most important camping rules, regardless of where you go. Be sure to put out your fire before bed, before heading out for the shoot, or when you leave the site at the end of your stay. The general rule of thumb is to make sure the coals or ashes are cold.
- 3. Clean up after your pets:** Whether you're at your campsite, walking through the grounds after the range is cold or hiking on the grounds, always clean up after your pets. Be sure your pet doesn't go to the bathroom on someone else's campsite, either.
- 4. Be a Good Neighbor:** Please be considerate of the other campers. Most campgrounds have specific rules about this, we are relying on your good sense.
- 5. Don't cut through campsites:** Unless you know your neighbors, avoid cutting through anyone's campsite. People make the site their personal space for the duration of the shoot. Don't intrude just to save a few minutes on your walk to the bathrooms.
- 6. Respect quiet hours:** We ask that you observe quiet hours from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. These are in place for those who need to get a good night's sleep after a tough day. Voices carry in the still of night, so please be respectful of this time. Be mindful of your early morning routine, as well.
- 7. Range Closure:** The range is closed or "cold" except during the match competition. No practice, sight in or shadow shooting is allowed at any place on the range, camping area or parking area while the range is closed.
- 8. Keep your pet on a leash:** With food, little kids and animal allergies most people will agree that they don't want your pet wandering around their campsite. Keep your pet on a leash at all times.
- 9. Put everything back:** If you moved the picnic table, or other items on the site, please move them back. If you created holes or trenches please fill them in, they can be dangerous trip hazards for others.
